EC slaps 24-hour ban on Mamata

Campaign ban till 8pm today, Didi to sit on protest; PM, CM continue slanging match

PNS NEW DELHI

On a day Prime Minister Narendra Modi and TMC supremo Mamata Banerjee traded charges on the Cooch Behar killing, the Election Commission (EC) on Monday imposed a 24-hour campaigning ban on the West Bengal Chief Minister for her "highly insinuating" and "provocative remarks" that the poll regulating body described as having "serious potential" to lead to a breakdown of law and order during elections.

during elections.

As per the order issued by the EC, the ban will come into effect from 8 pm on April 12, and continue till 8 pm on April 13. The action was taken by the polling body after Mamata was found "violating the Model Code of Conduct the Model Code of Conduct (MCC)" for appealing to the voters on communal lines.

Condemning Mamata's statements made during poll rallies on April 7 and 8, the EC advised her to desist from

using such statements in public while model code of conduct is in force.

The EC noted that the TMC chief made "highly insinuating and provocative remarks laden with serious potential of breakdown of law and order and thereby adversely affecting the election process." The EC said, "In fact, it is

a matter of deep regret that a media narrative was sought to be weaved hour after hour to misguide the biggest stakeholder which is the voters by a candidate who also happens to be the CM of the State. At least this should have been appreciated that the sideshow was fraught with immense potential to have adverse impact on law and order across West

Bengal and may be some other States. And all this was being done when the election process was/is on. There could not have been a greater misde-meanour," it said.

Lashing out at the EC order, Mamata said she would stage a dharna in the city on Tuesday in protest. The TMC questioned why only Mamata has been punished and BJP leaders left off hook.

Meanwhile, Modi launched a fierce broadside against Mamata. "Didi has been instigating her workers against the Central forces. Do not do this. Didi o didi, if you want to take out your anger, abuse me. But don't insult Bengal's dignity and tradition," he said.

India's daily rise outnumbers US-Brazil total

India records around 1.5 lakh new cases; CM Yogi rules out total count soars by 20 fold since Feb 1

PNS NEW DELHI

A mid horror stories of dead bodies piling up in hospitals and Covid treatment centres running out of beds and ventilators, India's Covid-19 count grew by around 1.5 lakh, going past the US and Brazil combined. India now has the second-highest number of cases in the world with the total crossing 1.34 crore, behind the US which has reported 3 crore cases so far.

On Sunday, India's daily count of 1.68 lakh cases was higher than the combined tally of the USA (47, 874 cases) and Brazil (37,537).

However, on Monday the cases dipped mainly due to lower testing on Sunday. Maharashtra reported a major decline, reporting around 51,751 cases, nearly 11,000 less than the previous day's tally.

However, the situation in

Delhi and neighbouring Uttar Pradesh remained grim, with the national Capital reporting 11,491 cases and UP recording 13,604 cases.

While Gujarat reported 6,021 new cases, 2,854 recoveries and 55 deaths in the last 24 hours, Rajasthan reported 5,771 new cases, 1,291 recoveries and 25 deaths during the same period. India's cases are also dou-

February 1, it has taken just ten weeks for the country to see a 20-time spike in the daily number of cases, a record of sorts across the world.

Meanwhile, on the second day of countrywide Tika Utsav (vaccination festival), India's Covid-19 vaccination coverage went past the 10.50 crore mark on Monday. Eight States account for 60.13 per cent of the total doses given so far in the country, according to the Union Health Ministry data. The first day of Tika Utsav on Sunday saw the administration of 30 lakh vaccination doses at 63,800 Covid Vaccination Centres across the country.

Sputnik V gets DCGI approval

PNS NEW DELHI

As the country grapples with surging Covid-19 cases and vaccine shortage, a panel of experts has recommended Russia's Covid vaccine Sputnik V for use in India with certain conditions. If approved by the regulator, Drug Controller General of India (DCGI), this will be the third vaccine to be used in India after Serum Institute of India's Covishield developed by Oxford-AstraZeneca — and Bharat Biotech's Covaxin.

Sources in the Government said that the Subject Expert Committee (SEC) of the DCGI on Monday took up the application of Dr Reddy's Laboratories seeking emergency use authorisation for Sputnik V.

The DCGI will take a final call on the recommendation. The vaccine would be imported from Russia for emergency use in the country, the sources said.

The DCGI has already given the emergency use authorisation for two Covid19 vaccines — Covaxin of Bharat Biotech and Covishield of Oxford-AstraZeneca manufactured by Serum Institute of India in Puné. Continued on Page 11

A sking officials to be on their toes to control the exponential spread of COVID-19 across the state, Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath said on Monday that neither his government will impose a lock-down nor let the people die in

misery.

"It is the responsibility of the officials to ensure that there is no shortage of hospital beds for the patients. People should get all facilities and there should be no shortage of essential items in the market," the chief minister said while addressing officials in a meeting here on Monday.

Expressing anger over private hospitals and labs fleecing people by charging more than the prescribed rates, Yogi Adityanath directed the officials to take action against them. He said that nobody would be allowed to take advantage of the helplessness of

the people.
"Stop it strictly. Incorrect information will result in harsh action against the guilty," the chief minister said and directed officials to take over such

hospitals.
"Investigation report should not be delayed and this should be communicated to the

The chief minister has emphasised on the expansion of lab and testing capabilities. Instructions have been given to increase the RT-PCR test

capacity to 70 per cent.
Yogi said: "Our priority is to implement an effective strategy to contain the spread of COVID-19. We will have to fight the pandemic vigorously with full preparation as there is no scope for any negligence in this fight."

Praising his government's efforts to control the spread of the novel coronavirus last year, the chief minister said, "Like the last year, we will have to fight this war with great strength. For the same, we will have to increase the beds in Level-2 (with oxygen facility) and Level-3 (with ventilators) Covid hospitals in sufficient quantity."

Yogi Adityanath also instructed the officials to dedicate half of the 108 ambulance service fleet for COVID-19 patients and the remaining half for non-Covid cases. He set the response time for these ambulances at 15 minutes. He laid emphasis on making the Integrated Command and Control Centre the focal point of the entire fight and monitoring its activity one by one.

Sensex plunges 1,707 pts on Covid, grim growth outlook

Retail inflation 4-month high at **5.5%** as food prices soar

PNS NEW DELHI

Spooked by the grim Covid-19 scenario and slashing down of India's growth outlook by multiple rating agencies, investors on Monday went for heavy selling of equity in banking, finance, and auto counters, triggering a huge collapse which saw Sensex crashing by over 1,707 points.

In more bad news on the

economic front, India's retail inflation rose to a four-month high of 5.52 per cent in March as food prices soared, according to the Government data released on Monday. The con-sumer price index (CPI)-based inflation was 5.03 per cent in the previous month (February 2021) and was 5.91 per cent in the same month last year



Food inflation accelerated to 4.94 per cent in March, as compared to 3.87 per cent in February. Inflation in "fuel and light" category remained elevated at 4.50 per cent during March compared to 3.53 per cent in February.

At the same time, the Index of Industrial Production (IIP)

contracted 3.6 per cent for February 2021, showed data released by the Ministry of





Statistics and Programme Implementation (MoSPI).

The industrial output contracted by 1.6 per cent in the previous month (January 2021) and expanded to 4.5 per cent in February 2020.

The manufacturing sector output contracted by 3.7 per cent in February, while the mining output declined by 5.5

The Ministry of Civil Aviation (MoCA) on Monday banned meal services on flights with less than two hours of travel duration to minimise the risk of Covid-19 infection. The norm will come into effect from April 15.

However, there are no However, there are no restrictions on serving meals on international flights as of now. Airlines are permitted to serve only pre-packed snacks, meals, and pre-packed beverages on flights that have duration of more than two hours.

"The airline operating flights on domestic sectors

While Har ki Pauri, considered the holiest of the ghats, was reserved exclusively for the Akhadas from 7 am onwards, common people also took the holy dip on the other ghats of the Ganga, revered by millions as a god-

The seers of different Akhadas, led by their Mahamandaleshwaras, took

As per the sequence set by the Akhil Bharatiya Akhada Parishad (ABAP), Sadhus of the Niranjani Akhada reached Har Ki Pauri first for the holy dip. They were also accompanied by members of the Anand Akhada.

The last king of Nepal, Gyanendra Bir Bikram Shah too took a holy dip along with Sadhus of the Niranjani Akhada. Taking a serious note of the cops' role, the senior superintendent of police in Bareilly placed all the policemen posted at the local police outpost under suspension and ordered a probe into the matter to take further legal action against them. A heavy police force was also deployed in the area to avert any further untoward

Reports said that the minor daughter of a resident of Mau Chandrapur hamlet in Ramnagar under the Aonla

police station in Bareilly eloped with a local youth. The resident contacted the policemen at Ramnagar outpost and alleged that his daughter was kidnapped by the youth and pleaded with the cops to get her freed from the clutches of the accused.

The cops, however, refused to act and allegedly demanded Rs 1 lakh from the man, saying that he had to spend some money if he wanted to get his daughter back.

An upset father later ran

from pillar to post to seek justice but after he failed to get any help, he mentioned his ordeal in a plain paper, holding the cops of the Ramnagar police outpost responsible for his death, and committed suicide on Sunday.

When the local policemen learnt about the incident, they reached the spot and after recovering the suicide note in which the man held them responsible for his death, tore the paper. On learning that the cops had destroyed the suicide note, the local residents became agitated and they attacked the police team with sticks and rods, injuring two policemen seriously.

Honey trap gang busted; 2 women PNS LUCKNOW among 5 held

Lucknow (PNS): A joint team of Hazratganj police and a surveillance team claimed to have busted a honey trap gang with the arrest of three men and two women. The men were identified as Azizul Hasan of Para, Pankaj Gupta and Atul Saxena (both of Alambagh). One of the women is aged 36 years while the other aged 40

The police said that the women would honey trap gullible people by calling them at odd hours. They would ask them to reach a place and then taken to some hotel room or flat. The women would seduce them and make them indulge in some obscene act. At that moment, the male members of the gang would barge into the room in police uniform. They would then blackmail the victims for extortion.

The arrests were made after a man reached the police station with a complaint that he was being blackmailed by two women and three men. He said the gang had obtained his semi-nude pictures and taken a huge sum from him. The police worked on the

case and it surfaced that the accused had asked the complainant to meet them at Scooters India crossing to give them more money. A team in civvies escorted the complainant to the place where he was supposed to meet the accused. The police asked the complainant to call the accused and later nabbed them. The police said the accused misused the police uniform and duped several people.

1 lakh MT wheat procured from 17,440 farmers

The official wheat procurement agencies in Uttar Pradesh have purchased one lakh metric tons of wheat from 17,440 farmers till April 12 since the procurement commenced on April 1.

The government has set up 6,000 procurement centres across the state for procurement of wheat at minimum support price from the farmers.

Despite the fresh surge in novel coronavirus cases, foolproof arrangements have been made at the wheat purchase centres with all aspects of Covid protocol being followed strictly, officials said here on Monday.

With the aim to double the income of the farmers, the UP government has introduced new devices and technology so that the farmers may receive the best price of their produce. In this regard, for the first

time in the country, the state government has introduced the electronic point of purchase (e-POP) machines for eliminating middlemen from the marketing process while ensuring transparency in the purchase of wheat. Uttar Pradesh is the first state in the country to initiate procurement by providing biometric authentication through e-POP device in wheat purchase with the aim to benefit real farmers and eliminate the role of middlemen and unauthorised persons in procurement under the minimum price support scheme.

The first procurement of wheat through e-POP was successfully made at Kundarki purchase centre of Moradabad district on April 7. The procurement of wheat through e-POP machines will start at

Lucknow (PNS): The Communist Party of India and Communist Party of India (Marxists) termed the all-party meeting on COVID-19 called by the UP government on Sunday as an eyewash and said it was a just a formality to reach a consensus on the novel coronavirus crisis. In a joint statement, the leaders of both the parties, Girish and Heera Lal Yadav, said coronavirus was now beyond control due to the car of the Central and UP governments. "The number of novel coronavirus infected people and the COVID-19 deaths is increasing day by day. In UP the active cases are touching the figure of 90,000. Every 24 hour, about 15,000 persons are testing positive. The number of deaths is above 1,000. The remdesivir which cost Rs 12,00 is being sold at Rs 40,000-42,000 in the black market and one can get it with much difficulty," the leaders said. They said the Covid vaccines had fallen short at various vaccination centres.

"At the centres where the vaccines are available, there is a huge rush and blatant disregard of the Covid protocol. The family members of the deceased COVID-19 patients have to wait for hours for final rituals," the leaders said. Active Covid cases climb to 23,090

 $W^{\rm ith~3892~fresh~infections}_{\rm reported~in~Lucknow~on}$ Monday, the active cases in the district climbed to 23,090. As many as 21 patients succumbed to Covid-19 while 958 recovered. Across the state, 13,685 people tested positive while 72 patients died. The fresh cases included 1,417 from Varanasi, 1,295 from Prayagraj, 716 from Kanpur, 474 from Gorakhpur and 336 from Meerut, catapulting the case tally to 7,05,619.

There were increased requests for referral to hospitals. Nodal officer for Covid, Lok Bandhu Hospital, Dr Arun Tewari said the picture was grim and all the hospitals were full to capacity.

"We have 157 beds which have been occupied, and our ICUs and HDUs are also full. When we get patients in the triage area, we assess their condition before hospitalisation. If their condition is serious, they are referred to other hospitals. But there are no beds available in the level-3 hospitals, with KGMU and SGPGI being full. We try to manage these patients with whatever facilities which we have," he said. He added that the death rate was also serious. "Four patients died at the hospital on Sunday night," he pointed out.

Dr Vishal Singh from Vivekananda Polyclinic said they were under tremendous pressure with requests pouring ing from South India.

in from all sides. "All 71 beds that we have are occupied," he said. A senior doctor from a Covid facility said he sat outside pulling the stretchers through last night as several staff members have tested pos-

Meanwhile, officials monitoring contact tracing said there were challenges galore. A senior official said that a high number of travellers are testing positive, especially those com-

He said most of them were rushing back to their home towns in the hope to return after the second wave. He said they could not carry out 100 per cent tracing even though they work from 7 am to 11 pm.

"SGPGI's lab is closed as several staff members have tested positive. Similar is the case with Balrampur Hospital lab. The samples are now being diverted to RMLIMS and other labs. The load is tremendous and now we have to keep two

members of our teams in the labs to trace the addresses," he

Meanwhile, there were continuous requests to the district administration officials for help to patients turning serious. A resident of Rajajipuram said that one of her friends was making extensive efforts to get a bed for her father tested positive during dialysis.

"His oxygen saturation level had fallen below 45, but they were unable to secure a

Abhishek on Monday visited the JTRI containment zone to take stock of the arrangements there. He inquired about the sanitisation work and was informed that all the houses and buildings were being sanitised and coded, and the microcontainment zones sealed.

7,343 Covid tests on one mobile number!

PNS LUCKNOW

This is straight from the ■ Ripley's Believe it or not. In the ongoing Covid tests, one mobile phone number was used for registration of 7,343 tests and all of them tested negative. This happened in Bareilly from January to March 31. This fraud speaks volumes about how some paramedics are ramping up the test numbers to be on the good books of the officials. The government claims that over two lakh Covid tests are carried out daily. Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath has said that half of these tests should be RT-PCR.

The fraud came to light when the mobile phone number 70197xxx31 was accidentally keyed in on the Covid portal during random checking. The officers were shocked to see 7,343 tests carried out on this number. Majority of these were antigen tests while a few were RT-PCR tests too. The reports of all these tests were

He was one of the last icon-ic figures of Lucknow who carried the fragrance, tehzeeb and the very soul of Awadhi culture and promoted it on every platform with his own choice of colloquial words that have long been lost in the changing facade of the city.

He saw a vibrancy in the old Lucknow and was an ambassador of its unique history and culture that set it apart from other cities. A man with a slight frame he was omniscient at all cultural evenings taking small steps with his walking stick as he cast a spell over his listeners like an eternal storyteller.

Lucknow lost its most ardent admirer and chronicler in Yogesh Praveen, who passed away on Monday afternoon. A storyteller par excellence, who could narrate a story of every nook and corner of Lucknow during the Nawabi era with dates, met his demise in times when his admirers could not even pay him a proper tribute. According to acting direc-

tor of Balrampur Hospital Dr GP Gupta, he was contacted by Praveen's relatives who said he had no pulse and was unconscious. "His kin briefed me about his medical history and requested for emergency services. However, he was brought dead to the hospital from his house in Maulviganj," Dr Gupta said. Younger brother Kamesh Srivastava and former chief engineer of Jal Nigam said Praveen was alright thought he had a slight fever on Monday for which he took some homeopathic medicine and then fell unconscious. "We called for

would have taken time, I drove him to Balrampur Hospital in my own car," he said.

Asked whether he was suffering from Covid, Kamesh said there were no such symptoms. Praveen (82), who resided in Rakabganj with a few supporters, had opted for medicine as a profession in the beginning. "It did not work for me when I was studying at Kanpur Medical College, and so I opted for literature instead and taught Hindi at Vidyant College till retirement," Praveen had told this reporter during a meeting. Author of over 20 books, Praveen kept alive the image of old Lucknow in the minds of his

readers. "Bitiya, for me Lucknow exists only in the old areas like Chowk, Nakkhas, Rakabganj, Aminabad, Aishbagh and trans-Gomti is a strange city. There is so much to explore in the old lanes which reek of flowers, atra, chaat and kali gajar ka halwa," he had told this reporter during an interaction after he won the Padma Shri award last year.

Praveen had a way with words and his books are anecdotes which he stringed togeththe ambulance but since it er in his interesting style of

speaking. The author would share nuggets of priceless information without any hassles. He would also lament the passing of an era.

"The people of the Nawabi

era had the leisure in indulging in sports such as chess which people do not have today. Right from the educated to the man on the street had a good knowledge of the game. 'Unplanned urbanisation, deforestation lead to diseases like Covid-19'

I Inplanned urbanisation, deforestation and man-animal conflict have led to diseases like Covid-19. This is the finding of Prof Naveen Kumar Arora, dean of the School of Earth and Environmental Sciences, and head of the department of Environmental Science (BBAU), who conducted a research on how a pandemic like the current unplanned urbanisation is also one has originated and how it is spreading at such a fast pace across the globe.

Referring to Covid-19, he said that the pandemic of an unprecedented magnitude has rocked mankind. 'As per the reports and research, the sight of origin of the outbreak of this pneumonia-like disease has been identified as Wuhan, Hubei province of China. The respiratory illness was found to be associated with a novel coronavirus which was later specifically named acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2) by World Health Organisation (WHO).

Arora pointed out that these types of pandemics have happened before and will appear in future also if we do not mend our ways and conserve environ-

Man, women found dead in abandoned car

PNS LUCKNOW

Aman and a woman were found dead inside an abandoned car in Baniya Mohal locality in Cantonment police station area on Monday night. A police team, led by senior officers, reached the scene and the car was found parked near NCC mess in the locality. Commissioner of Police

DK Thakur also reached the scene to oversee the investigation. Thakur said prima facie, it seemed that the man shot his partner and later killed himself inside the car. He said forensic teams had been summoned to the spot and the police were making further investiga-tion. The man was identified as Sanjay Nigam who had a hotel in Cantt.

Initial reports said some commuters spotted the car which was abandoned on the roadside. They later called police and a team reached the scene. The police recovered bloodstained bodies. The man had firearm injuries in the temple while the woman in the stomach. A pistol was found stuck in the man's hand. The police suspected that the man shot the woman probably after some difference and later shot himself. Both died due to excessive blood loss. The police found details of the car on the basis of its registration number. The police said they were also looking for some eyewitness who would have seen or heard anything unusual.

New surgical operations at SGPGI for diabetic foot

Lucknow (PNS): A new surgical operation has been performed in SGPGI over the last several months for treating patients who have poor blood supply to the feet, either due to diabetes or other medical conditions. These patients develop gangrene of the toes and legs and need an operation which can restore blood supply to that area of the wound. In the last six months, more than 10 such operations have been conducted by Dr Rajiv Agarwal from the Plastic Surgery department

and his team. Dr Agarwal said that the operation is bypass grafting of the diseased arteries in diabetics in which a good calibre vein is used to restore the blood flow across the diseased arterial segment by connecting the vein below and above the level of obstruction, using microvascular surgery.

The operation is complex and sophisticated and requires high level of competence, equipment and infrastructural support. This operation takes 5-8 hours and after completion of the operation, the limb has a completely new flow channel of fresh blood which helps in rapid healing of the wound and prevention of further gangrene to some extent," he explained.

He said that the operation costs Rs 1-2 lakh only in SGPGI. "The most important aspect which makes it different from other operations is that it provides extra blood to the feet," he added.

Researchers come up with pipeline tool for study of virus mutation

Lucknow (PNS): In a research carried out at the Biotechnology department of Amity University, the team has come up with a pipeline tool for studying the mutation of a virus. It is called GeVan: Genome Viral analysis (assembly pipeline).

Dr Prachi Srivastava from the department said that the severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2) is a novel humaninfecting strain of beta coronavirus. "Rapid advances and declining costs of high throughput sequencing technologies have allowed the virus to be sequenced globally in many individuals affected. While the next-generation sequencing technology offers a robust means of identifying possible pathogens from clinical specimens, easy and userfriendly bioinformatics pipelines are required to achieve a full viral genome sequence and with utmost accuracy. Towards this effort, we have written a detailed pipeline for analysing and decoding coronavirus sequencing data utilising open source

utilities," she said. "As in the current times viral mutations are becoming very problematic, it was an idea generated in the mind of our group to develop any software-based pipelines through which these viral genomic analysis would become comparatively easier," she said.

This pipeline is developed by the concept of SARS COV viral genomic data analysis.

But by the time the fire brigade reached the scene, the oxygen cylinder inside the ambulance exploded. In the blast, Hindi newspaper journalist Akhil Saxena and a shop owner, Manish,



"Akhil fractured his leg while the sole of Manish's foot blew up in the incident,' the ADCP said. He said three firemen, Rajesh Kumar, Durga Prasad and Gyan Prakash, were also sustained minor injuries in the mishap while trying to extinguish the fire.

The explosion was so intense that it was heard up to one kilometre, according to commuters and local residents. The police have detained Inayat and registered a case on the complaint of Akhil's brother. The police are investigating the case. The police carelessness of Inayat caused the incident.

"Inayat and the ambulance driver should have removed the oxygen cylinder before starting the welding work," the police said.

Make Remdesivir available to every patients, HC to Guj Govt

High Court on Monday pulled up the State Government for having such a system that put entire control of remdesivir injections under one agency, asking why was the crucial anti-Covid medicine not made available for everybody.

It also suggested that the government set up accountability at every booth level to keep a check on the outbreak.

In wake of the rising number of coronavirus cases in the state and the worsening situation in healthcare facilities, the high court had taken a suo moto cognizance of the issue and filed a PIL, titled 'Uncontrolled upsurge and serious management issues in Covid control', with the Central and state governments made respondents.

The bench of Chief Justice Vikram Nath and Justice Bhargav D Karia, set up to hear the matter, heard Advocate General, Kamal Trivedi, on behalf of the state government and posed a salvo of questions on various fronts due to which the present uncontrolled situation arose.

"Initially, when the pandemic struck last year, people were advised to home quarantine and also get treated at home. Now why have you changed it and insist on hospitalisation? Why are you insisting that remdesivir should only be available at hospitals and not for home patients quarantined who require the injections? Why is it not being available at all the hospitals? Why is it not available for anyone who needs it? Controlling these injections by supply from one outsourced agency is not at all in

public interest," it said. Accusing hospitals of exploiting the situation, the court said: "We have come to

> The court also noted that "right now it takes 5 to 7 days for a common man to get himself RT-PCR tested. By the time he or she gets results, has infected a lot many others".

> 'Why is it taking so long? We advise ramping up the testing facilities and centres,"

As the court asked the government what steps were taken to ensure the reduction of staff in various offices, the Advocate General said that only the paan shop owners association had come forward and voluntarily had decided to shut down for the weekends.

Sonia's letter to PM on Covid triggers charge of 'lobbying'

mid a massive surge in the Amid a massive surge in the Covid-19 cases in the country once again, Congress president Sonia Gandhi on Monday wrote to Prime Minister Narendra Modi highlighting certain issues and suggested some points to take into consideration to curb the spread of virus. The ruling BJP, however, accused the grand old party for "lobbying" for a particular pharmaceutical company. Sonia, in her letter which comes after her virtual meeting with the Chief Ministers of Congress-ruled States, underlined three issues for PM's consideration and appropriate

"I have had a detailed interaction with the Chief Ministers of States ruled by the Congress

Party and Ministers from States where the Congress is in alliance Governments, to take stock of the most disturbing Covid-19 situation," Sonia said in her let-

Speaking on vaccinations, she said, "Vaccines are our foremost hope. Sadly, most of the states, are left with a stock of just 3 to 5 days. While it will be necessary on one hand to substantially ramp up our domestic production capacity. It will also be prudent to allow emergency use authorities of all the vaccine candidates that have the required clearances without any further delay."

BJP's national general secretary BL Santosh countered the calls for approval to all vaccines and said, "Sputnik V had been approved for emergency use in India after bridge study by Dr Reddy's. All who are advocating approval to Pfizer without bridge studies in India as part of a lobby should understand that Indian lives also matter and you cannot bully the Narendra Modi Government." Sonia in her letter to PM also sought expansion of vaccination based on need and exposure rather than age and GST exemption for life-sav-

ing drugs and equipment.

"The numbers allocated to a state has to be based on the prevalence and projection of infection in that particular state. All instruments, medicines and infrastructure required to deal with COVID 19 should be made completely exempt from GST. Even ventilators, oximeters and oxygen cylinders presently attract GST as do key life-saying drugs like Remdesivir and Dexamethazone," the Congress

chief mentioned said.

Sonia also batted for a minimum income guarantee scheme saying as states imposed curfews, economic activity would be hit hard impacting the poor and daily wagers the most.

"I appeal to you to put into place the much-needed scheme of minimum monthly guaranteed income in place and transfer an amount of Rs 6.000 in every eligible citizen's account," she said.

Earlier in the day former party chief Rahul Gandhi led the party's "Speak up for vaccines" social media campaign asking the PM to "stop events, stop exports of vaccines and give vaccines to everyone in need. He also said the PM had said COVID would be controlled in 18 days. "It has been 385 days,"

I-Fix dental implant economical, far more effective: Surgeon

KANPUR (PNS): Noted dental surgeon, Dr Manish Vishnoi, while addressing a webinar on indigenous I-Fix dental implant organised by IIT-Delhi and Maulana Azad Dental University, said the dental implants were too costly and thus the new technology would be economical and far more effective. He said the i-Fix implant was conceptualised, designed and developed to prove its safety and efficy the Indian EDA approval and ISO 13485 Quality Certification was first obtained.

He said mini-implants were the new fashion in implant technology and used primarily for dentures. He said a series of mini-implants were placed through the gums and their posts were used to anchor the appliance in place. He said in the new procedure, miniimplants meant less pain and healing time, and normally cost less than traditional den-

tal implants. He said there were two different types of dental implants endosteal and subperiosteal. He said the former referred to an implant that was 'in the bone' while subperiosteal referred to an implant that rested on top of the jawbone under the gum tissue. He said subperiosteal implants were no longer in use today because of their poor long-term results in comparison to endosteal dental implants. He said the primary function of dental implants was for teeth replacement. He said there were areas in which implants could assist in other dental procedures.

Dr Vishnoi said due to their stability, dental implants could be used to support a removable denture and provide a more secure and comfortable fit. He said in addition, for orthodontics procedures, dental mini-implants could act as temporary anchorage devices (TAD) to help move teeth to a desired position. He said these mini-implants were small and temporarily fixed to bone while assisting in anchorage for teeth movement. He said they were subsequently removed after their function was served.

He said for patients who had lost all their teeth due to decay or gum disease of the upper or lower arch, an option was available to provide a very stable and comfortable prosthesis using a minimal number

of implants.

He said the new technology implants were strategically placed in areas of good strong bone, and a thin denture prosthesis was screwed into

CBI summons ex-Maha Home Minister over graft charges



The CBI has called former Maharashtra Home Minister Anil Deshmukh for questioning on Wednesday in connection with a preliminary inquiry into probe allegations of corruption levelled against him by former Mumbai Police commissioner Param Bir Singh and suspended police officer Sachin Waze.

On Sunday, the agency had grilled two Personal Assistants—Sanjeev Palande and Kundan— in connection with the ongoing PE for over eight hours. Two drivers of Waze were grilled on Sunday.

Waze, an Assistant Police Inspector, is also an accused in the NIA case relating to investigation of parking of an explosive-laden SUV outside industrialist Mukesh Ambani's residence in Mumbai.

The CBI notice, calling Deshmukh to join its probe team in Mumbai, was issued on Monday morning, a day after grilling of his two aides Sanjeev



Palande and Kundan, sources

The CBI is conducting a preliminary inquiry into the allegations against Deshmukh levelled by Singh after he was removed from the coveted post Mumbai Police Commissioner.

Singh's allegations are said to have been corroborated by Waze before the CBI probe team. Waze is in the custody of the National Investigation Agency (NIA) which is probing the SUV bomb scare case, the sources said.

Last week, the Bombay High Court had directed the CBI to conduct a preliminary inquiry into the allegations levelled by Singh against Deshmukh and submit a report within 15 days.

In a letter addressed to Maharashtra Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray, Singh had

alleged that Deshmukh had asked Waze to allegedly extort over ₹100 crore a month from nearly 1,700 bars and restaurants in Mumbai.

The High Court's order came in response to a petition from Singh seeking a CBI robe in the matter.

The CBI team of officers from the agency's headquarters here was sent to Mumbai to conduct the preliminary

giants are vying for the contract. The IAF desperately needs more modern aircraft as its squadron strength is fast depleting.

Against the sanctioned strength of 42 squadrons(one squadron has 18-20 jets), the IAF now has only 30-odd squadrons. Moreover, some the fighter jets are in the final stages of their operational life and will have to replaced quickly to sustain operational readiness.

Officials said the conference of apex level leadership is aimed at addressing the issues of IAF's operational capabilities in the times to come. A series of discussions would be conducted over a period of three days to address strategies and policies related to capabilities that would give IAF a significant edge over its adversaries. The India Meteorological Department (IMD) on Monday said several parts of the country are likely to receive rainfall in the next five days due to different cyclonic circula-

According to the National Weather Forecasting Centre of the IMD, under the influence of trough and cyclonic circulations over the south peninsula, scattered to fairly widespread rainfall with a thunderstorm, lightning and gusty winds of 30-40 kilometres per hour are very likely over southwest peninsular India in the next five days.

The IMD said isolated heavy rainfall is also likely over south and ghat areas of Tamil Nadu, Kerala and Mahe, coastal and south interior Karnataka during April 14-16. Another cyclonic circulation lies over southwest Madhya Pradesh and neighbouring areas.

Under its influence, isolated rainfall with thunderstorm, lightning and gusty winds (30-40 kmph) is very likely over Madhya Pradesh, Vidarbha, Telangana, Chhattisgarh, Gangetic West Bengal and Odisha during next 4-5 days and over Jharkhand during next 24 hours.

The IMD said a fresh active western disturbance is very likely to affect the western Himalayan region during April 14-17 and adjoining plains during April 15-17. It is very likely to cause scattered to fairly widespread rainfall with a thunderstorm, lightning and gusty winds (30-40 kmph) during April 14-17 over the western Himalayan region, and light, isolated to scattered rainfall with a thunderstorm, lightning and gusty winds (30-40 kmph) over adjoining

NGT nixes review plea for its order directing removal of illegal constructions

A bench headed by NGT Chairperson Justice A K Goel said direction for removing the encroachment could not be recalled while the issue as to whether the encroachment is there or not is yet to be determined by the statutory author-

Since the tribunal has not undertaken the exercise of determining individual issues and only directed compliance of mandate of law by statutory are aggrieved, they are free to take their appropriate statutory remedies against orders by which they are aggrieved," the

bench said. The NGT had earlier directed the Delhi government to remove illegal constructions in south Delhi's Jaunapur and Dera Mandi forest areas, saying forest laws cannot be defeated by allowing encroachments.

The tribunal had noted the submission that the proposed demolition on August 18, 2020, could not be held due to the non-availability of the police force despite informing them well in advance to depute sufficient police on the date of demolition. "While it is true that removing such encroach-ment is a challenge but if the Rule of Law is not to be enforced, we will have a lawless society. Forest laws cannot be defeated by allowing encroachments and thereafter pleading helpless in enforcing the law," the bench had said.

No golden rule

Armed Forces personnel react differently to different life-threatening situations

here are no golden rules for self-defence except that one has to gauge the gravity of the situation and act accordingly. Whether the security personnel deployed at West Bengal's polling stations would fire below or above the waist — especially as an agitated mob advances towards them — depends upon their threat perception and exigency. Even firing to kill is justified if the situation calls for it and if there are no other practical options. What is uncalled for in a certain situation can be well defensible in another. Recently, what happened in Sitalkuchi, Cooch Behar, is really unfortunate as four lives were lost in firing by the Central Industrial Security Force (CISF) personnel and no amount of sympathy or compensation can bring them back.



However, what is more unfortunate is the blame game politics taking place between the BJP and the TMC. While Chief Minister and TMC chief Mamata Banerjee termed the incident "genocide", Union Home Minister Amit Shah said that her exhortation to gherao the Central forces had instigated the people to attack the CISF. Sceptics argue that the deaths could have been averted had the CISF jawans fired on their legs with the intention of dispersing the mob and not killing anybody — an argument echoed by Mamata. However, such suggestions are solely being made based on politicisation of the issue and are far from being practical; these people know noth-

ing about what is required to be done by a professional force under such circumstances and have no idea of how fast things develop on the ground.

It cannot be denied that when an agitated mob of 300-400 people advances towards a polling booth to ransack it or towards the security personnel with an intention of snatching their weapons or even killing them should they put up resistance, the use of mild or medium force can aggravate the situation. In such a situation, the use of means like lathicharge, water cannon, rubber bullets or teargas, instead of acting as a deterrent, can rather act as a provocation to the mob which then can charge the personnel with more ferocity. What would follow is a bloodbath in which the security personnel and common citizens both lose their lives in large numbers. To keep the body count low and to disperse the bloodthirsty mob, there is no practical option but to fire with the intention to kill as only that would act as a deterrent under such circumstances. However, such nitty-gritty and technical knowhow are an integral part of the training of any professional force which is deployed to maintain law and order. Mamata's allegations that the CISF has no experience in controlling mobs are more unfounded than real. However, there should be a thorough inquiry into the incident and those responsible for instigating the violence should not be spared. If the security personnel are at fault, strictest action must be taken against those responsible. But we expect our politicians not to do any further politics on the matter — at least not over the deaths. It's plain shameful.

Tikait flexes muscles

The farmers have renewed their dialogue call while throwing a challenge to the Harvana CM

t appears that Bharatiya Kisan Union leader and Samyukt Kisan Morcha linchpin Rakesh Tikait has returned to the protest theatre with renewed vigour after his sabbatical, a period he had advised his comrades to utilise harvesting the season's crop till next month. Freshly back after attending to their domestic chores and famil-



ial duties, the cultivators sitting on dharna since November 2020 along the Capital's borders already made their presence felt last weekend when they blocked the Ghazipur border in what they said was a "warning to the Government". Thousands among these protesters have come from Haryana, Punjab and western Uttar Pradesh, even though there now is a nationwide wave in support of their cause the repeal of the three agriculture legislations that, they say, have been enacted to benefit certain corporates. But now, it seems, the farmer leaders have opted to flexing their muscles even though they well realise that no important political decisions at the national level would be taken in earnest till the results

of elections to four States and a Union Territory are declared in early May. It is in this light that Tikait is taking the fight to Haryana Chief Minister ML Khattar's door by claiming that the latter wouldn't be allowed to enter Badauli village in Panipat, where the Chief Minister is scheduled to be on April 14 for unveiling a statue of Babasaheb Bhimrao Ambedkar on the Dalit icon's birth anniversary. The farmer leader alleged that the actual reason for Khattar's visit was to "disturb the amity" among the area's cultivators "as per the BJP's plot". To avoid causing any imagined injury among Babasaheb's followers, Tikait also clarified that the farmers were not against the statue, they were against Khattar. In the same vein, however, ostensibly not to shut down any possible avenue which may lead to a dialogue with the Centre, the farmer leaders have also claimed that they are still willing to talk to the Centre on the three contentious Acts if invited for the same. Their only preconditions remain that the talks should resume where these were discontinued on January 22 and that their demands for total repeal remain unchanged. Well, though it seems like catch-22 without any quick resolution in sight, one would sincerely hope that under no situation would either side resort to any abhorrent step, such as violence.

Nepal staring at political disquiet



The Nepal top court's decision not favouring Oli has come as a surprise and now his political survival hangs by a fine thread

judicial scuffling in Nepal, its top court in two important verdicts nullified the dissolution of the democratically Parliament by the President and termed illegal the 2018 merger of the Communist Party of Nepal (Unified Marxist Leninist) and the Communist Party of Nepal (Maoist Centre) into the Nepal Communist Party (NCP), saying that another party existed with the same name. It means that the UML and the Maoist parties are back to their old selves.

While the reinstatement of the House comes as a big blow to Prime Minister KP Oli, who has emerged as an ultra-nationalist leader, an unexpected verdict on the future of a divided NCP has eventually put a full stop to the power struggle between the party chairs of the erstwhile NCP, Oli and Prachanda.

The verdict is being seen as an extrajudicial effort to save the country from plunging into political instability. Considering Oli's influence over the President's office, the Council of Ministers, Security Council, extraconstitutional bodies and the Press, it was believed that the court would favour Oli and acknowledge his faction as the legitimate NCP. That would have left Prachanda with no option but to form a new faction. Oli's legal team had also believed in a favourable verdict but the actual result has deepened the political crisis. Now, if the Maoists withdraw support, the Government will fall. The Madhesh-based Janata Samajbadi Party might prove to be the kingmaker as it can support the Nepali Congress and the Maoists to form a Government or ally with Oli to give further lease to his premiership.

An expected outcome: The 2018 merger of the two mainstream rivals had generated optimism among the Nepalese people that the new leadership was showing political maturity. However, it was only a matter of political survival for Oli and Prachanda as the former had planned to weaken the



interest of their people. Hence, the fallout was inevitable. Blaming and seeking: With the eventual fall, Oli is seeking to mend ties with New Delhi. To reach out to India, he has appeared on a number of Indian news channels to cry foul against former Prime Minister Prachanda, blaming him for dividing the party. The same Oli created his political stronghold through his anti-India manoeuvring and bashing of the Indian media for being unfair towards the "victim" country.

dispute. These offices are now attempting all the tricks to reach out to New Delhi. Also, despite a projected bonhomie with China, Oli is pushing for the supplies of the COVID-19 vaccines from India.

However, testing the trust will be the core of India's new relations with Nepal. On the other hand, Oli's biased approach towards China had come at the cost of substantial economic losses. Also, he signed the Treaty on Mutual Legal Assistance with Beijing, endangering the lives and rights of 20,000 Tibetan refugees in Nepal. The Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) is an obsession with the current regime despite Sri Lanka's exposé of the Chinese wrong-

doings.

While Oli may call it a balancing act between India and China, his actions speak otherwise. The alleged soft funding from China to Oli's political adventures in Nepal through the Madan Bhandari Foundation needs no explanation to assert his bonhomie with the dragon.

Uncertain future: While the politicos do not wish for Nepal to plunge back into insurgency, Oli's authoritarian attitude has cost Nepal dearly.

Politically, democracy is a casualty considering Oli's dream of a one-party rule in Nepal, with no political opponents outside and within the UML.

On the foreign policy front, Nepal, with its vast hydropower potential, can use India's expertise in generating power. A mutually beneficial plan could have paved the way for Nepal's economic growth. However, far from new agreements, Nepal seems to have no plan to revitalise treaties like the Mahakali, signed in 1996 with India, which can generate cooperation between them. Meanwhile, false promises under the BRI and dreams of a trans-Himalayan railway with China have garnered Oli enough political capital.

Oli's aspirations, accompanied by hollow economic and development strategies, will lead Nepal towards an uncertain future which is being watched carefully by the people of Nepal and international actors, including India. (The author is an ICSSR

TIME TO REDEFINE RELATIONS WITH RUSSIA

- When Russian Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov visited both New Delhi and Islamabad during his whirlwind tour, the visible and palpable warmth between the two nations at Islamabad was conspicuous by its absence in Delhi. Not mere photo ops, Russia's assurance to Pakistan on supply of highly sophisticated military equipment and the promise to conduct joint military exercise there does not bode well for India's interests. Well, it is not as if all of a sudden Moscow has found a new strategic and military partner in Islamabad. For years, after a considerable period of strong dislike, Russia has built bridges with Pakistan in its own way. But in international relations, what is unsaid often matters more than what is said. As a matter of protocol, a visiting Foreign Minister may or may not call on the Prime Minister of the host country. But PM Narendra Modi is known to rise above formalities. REMEMBERING THE 'GREATEST INDIAN'

Ambedkar did not seek equality only for Dalits but tried to bring all of India under the umbrella of his great ideals

few years ago, a major English TV news channel in the country started a drive to choose the "Greatest Indian" through online and mobile voting. The people of the country chose Babasaheb Bhimrao Ambedkar as the "Greatest Indian." This is Babasaheb's greatest legacy. Unlike other leaders, he is still as relevant in the hearts of crores of Dalits and those who fight for a dignified life for underprivileged Indians, as he was in his time. As the country celebrates the 130th birth anniversary of Babasaheb on April 14, Ambedkar's struggle and values continue to inspire Indians and even the Black community in the US and others fighting discrimination across the globe. Ambedkar was different from other leaders in the sense that he encouraged the underprivileged to get their rights through education and political struggle. Despite all the protests, insults, reproach and neglect, he did not tread the path of violence and never dreamed of destroying the system. Staying within the confines of constitutional commitments, working within the system and changing it from within, were the hallmarks of his struggle



Babasaheb was not only the principal architect of the Indian Constitution, he firmly believed in the role of constitutional values in keeping the democratic system alive. Education, democratic struggle and unity were the core of his philosophy. He drew the path between socialist philosophy and communism for social justice. After the Round Table Conferences in 1931, the British proposed a separate electorate. When Madan Mohan Malaviya spoke to Babasaheb in this regard and envisaged its wider implications on Hindu society, Ambedkar agreed to have a more consistent reservation system for Dalits in place of a separate electorate. Thus, the historic Poona Pact of 1932 was signed. Ambedkar always fought for social justice and said that the scriptures that approve untouchability needed to be seen in the light of new knowledge. Ambedkar did not seek equality, fraternity and freedom only for the Dalits but also tried to bring the entire Indian society under the umbrella of his great ideals. When Pandit Nehru went back on his promise on the Hindu Code Bill, Ambedkar resigned from the Cabinet. Currently, while there is intense churning on its role in ensuring democracy and social justice on a global scale, Babasaheb has become more relevant than ever.

The values of dialogue, constitutional struggle and constant coordination are now playing an important role in making the present system more effective. Babasaheb had also made similar efforts in the process of nation building. Just as the Government is working to reestablish India as the "Vishwa Guru", Ambedkar, too, constantly strived for a global stature for Bharat. He was opposed to the prominence of competitive allegiance of religion, culture, caste and language. He believed that this made it difficult to cultivate Indianness and loyalty to India. He said, "I want people to be Indian first and to be Indian till the end, nothing but Indian.

Following in his footsteps, the Centre is not only ensuring social justice, but is also striving to bring the underprivileged into the mainstream through economic empowerment. 'Start-up India', 'Standup India', the National Scheduled Castes Finance and Development Corporation and scholarships for secondary and higher studies, are all efforts in this direction. On April 14, the whole world will salute Babasaheb, the true son of the nation, and his contribution towards nation building will be remembered. However, the younger generation must not only follow Babasaheb's ideals on his birth anniversary but every moment of their life.

Nix sovereign guarantee clause for the NaBFID



To bail out an entity majority-owned and controlled by private parties using the taxpayers' funds is a bad idea

In her Budget speech, Finance Minister (FM) Nirmala Sitharaman had proposed setting up of a new Development Financial Institution (DFI) termed the National Bank for Financing Infrastructure and Development (NaBFID). The Government passed a Bill to establish the NaBFID, its objective being "to coordinate with the Centre and States, regulators, financial institutions (FIs), institutional investors and other relevant stakeholders, in India or outside India, to facilitate building and improving the relevant institutions to support the development of long-term non-recourse infrastructure financing in India, including the domes-

tic bonds and derivatives markets."

The NaBFID will also be involved "in lending or investing, directly or indirectly, and seek to attract investments from private sector investors and institutional investors, in infrastructure projects located in or outside India." It will also help provide financing options for projects under the muchtrumpeted National Infrastructure Pipeline (NIP). Under the NIP, the Union Government has identified over 7,000 projects in all crucial sectors such as roads, highways, railways, ports, power transmission lines, gas pipelines and so on, requiring an investment of over ₹100 lakh crore over the next

The Government will infuse ₹20,000 crore in NaBFID as budgetary support which will be leveraged to generate a financing capability of over ₹3,00,000 crore. This is peanuts when compared to the mammoth requirement of around ₹90 lakh crore (excluding about ₹10 lakh crore: ₹4,39,000 crore spent during 2020-21, plus a planned spending of ₹5,54,000 crore for 2021-22). But the moot question is whether the new DFI is a sustainable propo-

This is not the first time that the idea of a DFI has been floated. The first such institution, namely the Industrial Finance Corporation of India (IFCI), was set up in 1948, followed by the Industrial Development Bank of India (IDBI) in 1964. In the private sector, the Industrial Credit and Investment Corporation of India (ICICI) was set up in 1955. This was in sync with the global trend in Europe, Japan, the US and other Asian countries where the DFIs were set up primarily to rebuild infrastructure devastated by World War II. After the task was completed, those institutions were wound up. In India, how far these institutions (IDBI/IFCI) helped in building infrastructure is debatable. However, one thing is abundantly clear; they became a drain on the national exchequer through a variety of supports such as Government guarantees, capital commitments including from the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) along with direct and indirect financing by the latter to meet their needs.

In the 90s, the Narasimham/Khan committees recommended — as part of the financial reforms package — their gradual phase-out. They were either required to transform into banks or close if they

The panels also recommended the development of domestic bonds and derivatives markets to galvanise investors to deploy their savings for long-term financing infrastructure projects. As a follow up, the then Vajpayee Government converted the IDBI into a commercial bank in 2003. The promoters of ICICI did this much earlier in 1994 by converting the institution into the ICICI Bank. However, the other most

crucial recommendation remained unattended. In the absence of sustainable arrangements for channelising household savings for long-term investment (a bank's source of capital is primarily short-term deposits resulting in what is termed as assetliability mismatch), currently much of infrastructure financing is done by the Government of India (GOI) by way of budgetary support.

The GOI, in turn, raises resources — albeit for providing budgetary support — by imposing cesses, fees and other levies such as the Central Road and Infrastructure Fund (CRIF), the Permanent Bridge Fees Fund (PBFF) and monetisation of the National Highways Fund (NHF). For instance, during 2020-21, out of the ₹42,500 crore allocated to the National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) for executing roads and highways projects, the contribution of the above-mentioned funds was 49 per cent, 27 per cent and 24

per cent respectively.
In this backdrop, and with the present arrangement meeting only a small portion of the mammoth funding needs (₹100 lakh crore under the NIP), setting up of dedicated institutions such as the NaBFID prima facie appears to be an attractive proposition. In fact, the Modi Government wants to use the NaBFID as an anchor DFI.

To begin with, the NaBFID will be 100 per cent owned by the GOI, with equity capital coming by way of budgetary support. Over a period of time, the latter will reduce its shareholding to 26 per cent, implying that the majority ownership and control fessionally-run body, with the Government only appointing the

The proposed structure of the new DFI points towards the Government going for a hands-off approach as the Act does not provide for an oversight mechanism; it will be free from the "three Cs" i.e. the Central Bureau of Investigation, the Central Vigilance Commission and the Comptroller and Auditor General of India. In fact, it goes a step forward by seeking to protect the management for the decisions taken as an "act of good faith." Up to this point, things are hunky-dory.

However, problems begin to creep when we look at this: "The Act empowers the GOI to extend sovereign guarantee in case of a default." The guarantees cover a wide range like any liabilities of its own subsidiaries, joint ventures, branches and other similar arrangements; letters of comfort, or letters of credit for loans or bonds and debentures issued by any DFI funding infrastructure projects in India; and guarantee of the simplified processes, enforcement of NaBFID's bonds, debentures, loans and borrowings from multilateral institutions, sovereign wealth funds (SWFs), and other foreign institutions. To bail out an entity majorityowned and controlled by private parties using the taxpayers' funds is a bad idea. Furthermore, to do this when the Government is not even exercising any external oversight makes it abhorrent. The FM's defence that "an audited report would be placed in Parliament every year, besides the

NaBFID having to furnish to the GOI and the RBI a copy of its balance sheet and accounts, together with a copy of the auditor's report and a report of its working during the relevant year, within four months from the date on which its accounts were closed and balanced" does not inspire confidence.

One shudders to fathom the contingent liabilities emanating from the above open-ended guarantees provided under the Act and their impact on the fiscal deficit (FD). Already, the FD for 2021-22 is put at 6.8 per cent of the Gross Domestic Product which is almost double of what is permitted under the Fiscal Responsibility and Budget Management. For 2025-26, the FM puts it at 4.5 per cent. The NaBFID Act would result in spiralling of these numbers.

Team Modi needs to take a relook at the "sovereign guarantee" clause in the NaBFID Act. It should be deleted. As for giving comfort to investors, if only project proponents can generate the desired cash flows (this would require transparency and efficiency in project execution, contracts, freedom from bureaucratic red tape and above all, realistic pricing of services shorn of populism), this will be automatically assured.

On the other hand, if these prerequisites are lacking, resulting in shortfall in cash flows, then even the offer of sovereign guarantee won't provide much comfort even as the NaBFID, too, will end up being a drain on the exchequer just as the erstwhile IDBI.

Playing politics over vaccines will not help the cause

She said: "As the principal Opposition party, it is our responsibility to raise issues and push the Government to move away from PR tactics and act in the interest of the people?

year. Maharashtra was the worst-hit State during both the significant surges of COVID-19 cases. As of April 8, almost 24 million doses were in stock and another 19 million were in the pipeline. Capital markets watchdog Sebi on Monday came out with fresh guidelines on reporting formats for mutual funds.

The Indian rupee fell for the ■ sixth straight session to mark its lowest level in nearly nine months at 75.05 against the American currency on Monday as investors fretted over the prospects of lockdown in some parts of the country amid continuous rise in Covid-19 cases.

At the interbank foreign exchange, the rupee settled 32 paise lower against the greenback as weak domestic equities. rising crude oil prices and foreign fund outflows also weighed on sentiment.



Iran blames Israel for Natanz incident

Iran blamed Israel on Monday for a sabotage attack on its underground Natanz nuclear facility that damaged its centrifuges, an assault that imperils ongoing talks over Tehran's tattered nuclear deal and brings a shadow war between the two countries into the light.

Israel has not claimed responsibility for the attack. It rarely does for operations carried out by its secret military units or its Mossad intelligence agency. However, Israeli media widely reported that the country had orchestrated a devastating cyberattack that caused a blackout at the nuclear

facility.

While the nature of the attack and the extent of the damage at Natanz remains unclear, a former Iranian official said the assault set off a fire while a spokesman mentioned a "possible minor explosion."

The attack also further strains relations between the U.S., which under President Joe Biden is now negotiating in Vienna to re-enter the nuclear accord, and Israel, whose Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has vowed to stop the deal at all



Netanyahu met Monday with U.S. Defense Secretary Lloyd Austin, whose arrival in Israel coincided with the first word of the attack. The two spoke briefly to journalists but took no questions.

"My policy as prime minister of Israel is clear: I will never allow Iran to obtain the nuclear capability to carry out its genocidal goal of eliminating Israel," Netanyahu said. 'And Israel will continue to defend itself against Iran's aggression and terrorism."

At an earlier news conference at Israel's Nevatim air base, Austin declined to say whether the Natanz attack could impede the Biden administration's efforts to reengage with Iran in its nuclear ogramme.

Those efforts will continue," Austin said. The previous American administration under Donald Trump had pulled out of the nuclear deal with world powers, leading Iran to begin abandoning the limits on its atomic program set by the accord. But German Foreign Minister Heiko Maas expressed concern that it could affect the talks. "All of what we are hearing from Tehran is not a positive contribution to this," Maas told reporters.

In a statement, the White House said it was aware of the Natanz attack and that "the U.S. Was not involved in any man ner," without elaborating.

Lebanon extends area claimed in border dispute with Israel

ebanon's outgoing minister of Lpublic works said Monday that he has signed a decree that would increase the area claimed by the Mediterranean country in a maritime border dispute with

Public Works Minister Michel Najjar told reporters that he has signed an amendment of the decree that would formally extend Lebanon's claims by 1,430 square kilometers (550 square miles).

The unilateral move by Lebanon is likely to anger Israel and the U.S. Who are not expected to recognise Beirut's extension of the disputed area.

Lebanon and Israel began indirect talks with U.S. Mediation in October to reach a deal over the disputed area that is believed to be rich with oil and

The meetings that stopped few weeks later were being held at a UN Post along the border of the two nations that remain

technically in a state of war. The negotiations were the first non-security talks to be held between the two countries, which have no diplomatic relations following decades of conflict. Resolving the border issue could pave the way for lucrative oil and gas deals on both sides.

In late October, the Lebanese delegation to the talks - a mix of army generals and professionals — offered a new map that pushes for an additional 1,430 square kilometers (550 square miles). This area is to be included

in Lebanese territory on top of the already disputed 860 square kilometer- (330 square mile-) area of the Mediterranean Sea that each side claims is within their own exclusive economic Najjar said, however, that

the decree still required the signatures of the defense minister, prime minister and president to go into effect. The announcement came as

US Under Secretary of State for Political Affairs David Hale was expected in Lebanon later this weeks to meet Lebanese officials. Lebanon is passing through

its worst economic and financial crisis in its modern history and had plans to start drilling in search for oil and gas in the disputed area this year.

Israel has already developed offshore natural gas rigs, producing enough for domestic consumption and export abroad. Lebanon hopes that its own oil and gas discoveries will help alleviate its long-running eco-

Cairo: For Ramadan this year, Magdy Hafez has been longing to reclaim a cherished ritual: performing the nighttime group prayers called taraweeh at the mosque once again.

Last year, the coronavirus upended the 68-year-old routine o the mosque to perform those prayers, traditional during Islam's holiest month.

The pandemic had disrupted Islamic worship the world over, including in Egypt where mosques were closed to worshippers last Ramadan.

"I have been going to the mosque for 40 years so it was definitely a very, very, difficult thing," he said. "But our religion orders us to protect one

other feeling, and the spiritu-ality in Ramadan is like nothing else."

Egypt has since allowed most mosques to reopen for Friday communal prayers and for this Ramadan it will let precautions, including shortening its duration.

Daunte Wright death in Minnesota traffic stop sparks unrest

As on Monday cumulatively, 10,45,28,565 vaccine doses have been administered through 15,56,361 sessions, as per the provisional report till 7 AM. These include 90,13,289 healthcare workers (HCWs) who have taken the 1st dose and 55,24,344 HCWs who have taken the 2nd dose, 99,96,879 frontline workers (FLWs) (1stdose), 47,95,756 FLWs (2nddose), 4,05,30,321 1st dose benefiries more than 60 years old and 3,20,46,911 (1st dose) and 6,78,360 (2nd dose) beneficiaries aged 45 to 60.

CM YOGI RULES OUT LOCKDOWN IN STATE

Additional Chief Secretary (Information) Navneet Sehgal appealed to the people not to go to crowded areas and wear masks when they leave the house.

"Arrangements are being made to implement a strategy to control the infection. The number of beds (in Covid hospitals) has been increased and there is adequate availability of medical oxygen in the state," he said and asked people not to get vayed by rumours.

Sehgal said that since April 11, Tika Utsav was being celebrated in 6,000 centres and their number had been increased to 8,000. He said so far the first dose of Covid vaccine had been given to 75.76 lakh people and 12.70 lakh people had been administered the second dose of the vaccine. Thus, he said, a total of 88 lakh vaccine doses had been given to people.

Sehgal said there were 23,937 containment zones in the state. He advised the people to cooperate with the government machinery and follow the restrictions imposed by them.

Additional Chief Secretary (Medical and Health) Amit Mohan Prasad said the capacity of Covid testing had been increased. He said a total of 1,93,379 samples were tested in the last one day out of which 89,000 samples were tested through

Meanwhile, with 3892 fresh infections reported in Lucknow on Monday, the active cases in the district climbed to 23,090. As many as 21 patients succumbed to Covid-19 while 958 recovered. Across the state, 13,685 people tested positive while 72 patients died. The fresh cases included 1,417 from Varanasi, 1,295 from Prayagraj, 716 from Kanpur, 474 from Gorakhpur and 336 from Meerut, catapulting the case tally to 7,05,619.

SPUTNIK V GETS DCGI EXPERT PANEL APPROVAL

In September last year, Dr Reddy's partnered with the Russian Direct Investment Fund (RDIF) to conduct clinical trials of Sputnik V and for its distri-

bution rights in India. Sputnik V uses two different disarmed strains of the adenovirus, a virus that causes the common cold, as vectors to deliver the vaccine dose. It is 91.6% effective against symptomatic Covid-19 in the interim analysis of phase 3 clinical trial, which included data on 19,866 volunteers

Following record increase in Covid cases and in view of the shortage of two vaccines-Covishield and Covaxin which are being administered presently under the nationwide vaccination programme, health experts had been asking the Government to give approval to other shots as well to meet the vaccine need in the country.

The Minister said the decision to postpone the Classes 10 and 12 board examinations was taken after consultations with various stakeholders — students, teachers, parents, elected representatives from across parties, academicians & tech giants — in the wake of rising coronavirus cases. It may be recalled that on April 3, the Maharashtra Government had — as a consequence of the severe Covid-19 that the State is reeling under — announced that all State board students from Class 1 and 8 would be promoted to the next without any examination. "In view of the ongoing situation due to #Covid 19, all State board students across Maharashtra State from Class 1 to Class 8 will be promoted to the next class without any examinations," she had tweeted.

NO MEALS IN LESS THAN 2-HOUR FLIGHTS

"Airlines are permitted to serve only re-packed snacks, meals and pre-packed beverages on flights that have a duration of more than two hours, subject to the conditions include that in all classes, tray set up, plates and cutlery will be completely disposable with no re-use, or cleaned and disinfected rotables will be used; Used disposable trays/crockery's /cutleries shall not be used; In all classes, tea/coffee/alcoholic and non-alcoholic beverage services will be in disposable cans/containers/bottles glasses and there will be no pouring service. Meanwhile in India, the number of Covid-19 cases are increasing," it said. India has overtaken Brazil to become the second-most affected country globally in terms of Covid cases, after the USA. India's overall tally reached 1.35 crore, surpassing Brazil's 1.34 crore cases.

When scheduled domestic flights were resumed on May 25 after coronavirus lockdown last year, the Ministry had allowed the airlines to serve in-flight meals under certain conditions.

Meanwhile, the surge in cases has prompted Air India to opt for 100 per cent pre-flight testing for crew operating nonstops to US, UK, Canada and Australia. Air India has also started post-flight testing for crew on flights from UAE, UK and

Scheduled international flights have been suspended in India since March 23, 2020, due to the coronavirus pandemic. However, special international passenger flights have been operating under the Vande Bharat Mission since last May and under bilateral air-bubble arrangements formed with 28 countries since July.

Look out for tremors



World Parkinson's Day is celebrated on April 11 in the memory of Dr James Parkinson's birthday. It was in 1817, in a landmark essay, *Essay on the Shaking Palsy* based on the observations of six patients, he described the cardinal signs of Parkinson's disease, which included, posture, festination of gait and tremors. More than later 200 years the Parkinson's disease remains a clinical diagnosis based on the physician's observaremains a clinical diagnosis based on the physician's observation of the symptoms of the patient.

Early signs and symptoms: The most common early symptom of Parkinson's disease is tremors. The typical Parkinsonian tremors are called pill rolling tremor, it looks like as if the person is rolling pills. The most important characteristics of these tremors are that they are asymmetric, and usually start on one side and are suppressed during actions. For example, if the patient wants to drink a cup of tea the tremor will stop while drinking but as soon as he puts down the cup, and the hand starts to rest, the tremor will start. The other common presenting symptom is slowness. Many patients complain that their hand has become slow or the range of the hand movement has decreased. This leads them to seek opinion from Orthopaedic doctors where the diagnosis gets little delayed.

The third common symptom again associated with tremors and slowness is the change in handwriting. It is not surprising for many patients to be diagnosed with Parkinson's disease fol-

There gait becomes slow and rolling pills shuffing, interpretation attributed to old age and hence shuffling. Many times, this gets there is a delay in the diagno-

Once again, the clue here is asymmetry, one leg becomes slower than the other. It looks like the patient has developed a mild paralysis and is dragging his feet. Another form of gait difficulty is freezing. Where the legs stick to the ground and it is difficult for patient to move forward. This is more pronounced when the patient walks through narrow corridors or in a crowded space. Occasionally if the gait disturbances is not detected early and diagnosed correctly it leads to falls and many patients present with falls, however, falls are not the first symptoms of Parkinson disease and if patient is suffering from falls than either he is an advanced Parkinson's disease patient or is suffering from some

The third symptom that James Parkinson's described was stooped posture. Usually, this is also attributed to old age, if it occurs in elderly. The change in the posture comes little later. Some of the subtle symptoms of Parkinson disease that can get unnoticed are unexplained constipation, sleep disorders, lack of smell, mask like face and speech disturbances. Many of these appear much before even the tremor begins.

Parkinson's is more commonly seen in elderly patients above 60 years of age. However, a small percentage of patients present below the age of 40 years. These patients are known as young onset Parkinson's disease. A very small percentage of patients can get this disease below the age of 20 years and this is called Juvenile Parkinson's disease.

The diagnosis essentially still remains clinical. When there is a doubt about the diagnosis, specialised investigations like MRI or SPECT scans are performed to exclude other pathologies.

The growing cases of COVID-19, with people who have been fully vaccinated also testing positive, has raised an alarm. MUSBA HASHMI speaks with doctors who talk about the reasons behind it and why it is still the best option

even after receiving both the vaccine shots made headlines, the efficacy of the vaccine came under question. With people wondering why to get vaccinated if one can anyway get infected with Coronavirus, doctors believe it is still the best bet.

"It is not correct to think that getting vaccinated will prevent one from catching the infection. A fully vaccinated person can still be infected but the viral load of such a person will be far less than someone who is not vaccinated or partially vaccinated. The antibodies produced by the vaccine helps in fighting off the virus, which in turn, reduces the chances of that person transmitting the virus to other people," Dr Deepak Verma, Internal Medicine, Columbia Asia Hospital, Ghaziabad, tells you.

There are reports that not administering the jab at the right spot can be one of the reasons of a person catching the virus, however, Dr Verma dismisses all these

"The vaccines approved for use in India are intramuscular in nature and a vaccinated person getting COVID has got nothing to do with how a vaccine is administered - there is no evidence so far that a wrong way of administering a vac-

oon after the reports of doctors getting COVID positive cine can affect its efficacy; however, it can increase pain, swelling and er, it can increase pain, swelling and reduce the range of motion in that area," he says.

> Dr Arunesh Kumar, Senior Consultant & Head Respiratory Medicine/Pulmonology, Paras Hospital agrees with Verma and tells you that there is yet no vaccine that guarantees 100 per cent protection against the corona virus.

"Even if you are vaccinated, you must follow the safety rules suggested by doctors. Vaccination is a must to reduce the transmission rate and thus everyone must get it. Even after receiving the COVID-19 vaccine, we must continue taking all precautions like the use of face cover or masks, hand sanitisation and maintain distancing. These behaviours must be followed both at the session site and in general. Vaccination reduces the severity of disease and reduce the transmissibility of virus,"

However, the rising concerns may raise doubts in the mind of the people about getting vaccinated. But, experts say this is not the way

"One shouldn't be apprehensive about getting the vaccination done. While it doesn't provide 100 per cent efficacy, it is still the best bet. getting the vaccination done, one must follow all the safety precautions that are laid out by the Government. Becoming complacent is one of the major reasons of people catching the infection even after the getting the jab," Dr Verma tells you.

Dr Satish Kaul, HOD and Director, Internal medicine, Narayana Hospital, Gurugram , says that vaccines are surely safe if doses are taken within prescribed time that too with all required pre-

"We need to understand that vaccine basically provides protection from the severity of the disease; it saves us from getting chronically sick. It potentially saves us practically from ICU, ventilators and oxygen support, it helps to weaken the mechanism of disease in human body. Hence, vaccine beneficiaries are supposed to continue wearing masks, maintaining social distancing and COVID appropriate behaviour even after getting vaccinated,"

he suggests.
Also after taking second dose be extra cautious for at least two weeks, follow all precautionary measures. "Experts believe that one has to not get infected for at least two weeks after getting the second dose in order for the vaccine to be effective. Hence, these two weeks are the most crucial," Kaul adds.

YOUNG ONES STAY INDOORS

The new wave of COVID-19 is wrecking havoc, especially among children, as more and more test positive. SHALINI SAKSENA speaks

to doctors to tell you more

The second wave of COVID-19 is far deadlier than what it was last year. This time round, the cause for alarm is two-fold. First, even those who have been vaccinated have tested positive. Second, more and more children are falling victim to the virus. An AIIMS report in November 2020 revealed that almost 40 per cent of all the persons who tested positive for coronavirus across age groups were found to be asymptomatic and 73.5 per cent, the highest proportion of asymptomatic cases was reported among children below the age of

Come March 2021, and the number of children who have tested positive has reached alarming proportions. Dr Merlin Moni, Division of Infectious Diseases, Amrita Hospital, Kochi says that scientific explanation for the increase in the number of cases in kids is at present incomplete.

"However, they are issues specific 15 children which could contribute to current

increasing number. All schools reopening with challenges on mask, social distancing, rising community spread and lack of vac-cine for them is making them vulnerable. Studies have already proven that there could be as much as three times increased number of cases with school reopening. In addition, there could be variants which are evaluating especially in the scenario of complete vaccination," Moni explains. Another reason, one is told, could be due to: New viral variant which will alter behaviour of the virus.

There is a silver lining though. Most of the vaccines which are already being approved for the adults could be used in children but the phase II, III, IV trials are lagging for them.

Many vaccines have already completed trials in adolescents (above 12 years) and have generated safety and efficacy profile of the vaccine, similar to over18 years' age group. However, the trials in special populations including younger age group is on its way. Pregnancy and lactation are other categories for which data regarding vaccine use is lagging. The solution to this situation bears no shortcuts," Moni tells you.

Another plus is that while more children are getting infected and becoming symptomatic as compared to the first wave. the number requiring intensive care is Dr Rachna Sharma, senior consultant,

BLK Super Speciality Hospital in the Capital tells you that the situation is definitely alarming at present. "As compared to last year, even asymptomatic kids are now testing positive. There is no single reason for this. The new variant, no masks, no social distancing when an adult in the house tests positive are some of the reasons," she tells you.

The solution is simple. First, keep the kids indoors at all times. "Second, when an adult in the house tests positive keep them away. The young, people under 45 need to be extremely careful since the vaccine doesn't include them. One has to behave like responsible citizens. The fact that so many doctors have also tested positive goes to show there is need to tread with caution. Third, wearing a mask, maintaining social distancing, not go out and when adults do so, maintain COVID-19 SOP and keep away from social gathering can go a long way in keeping the children as well as the adults safe," Sharma says.

Maybe that explains why Mourinho was so irritated with Solskjaer after a 3-1 home loss to United saw Tottenham fall six points from fourth place. That spot is occupied by West Ham again after the east London club beat Leicester 3-2 on Sunday.

The post-match focus at Tottenham was less on Edinson Cavani's diving header that put second-place United 2-1 in front and more on the circumstances that denied the forward the game's opening goal.

Cavani had slotted through Hugo Lloris' legs after the ball was rolled into his path by Paul Pogba. But then the goal was ruled out after a lengthy VAR review penalized Scott McTominay for a push on Son Heung-min who went tumbling to the ground.

Hideki Matsuyama wins the Masters for his nation

AP AUGUSTA Hideki Matsuyama almost turned down his first chance to play the Masters. It was a month after a devastating earthquake and tsunami in sasters that killed thousands and destroyed much of the region he called home in

March 2011. He decided to play a month later, only because he thought it would lift spirits.

A decade later, he lifted his country again — becoming Japan's first man to win a golf major. Matsuyama's one-shot victory over Will Zalatoris at Augusta National made him the Masters champion, easily the biggest moment for the sport in his golf-crazed home-

"I can't say I'm the greatest," Matsuyama said. "However, I'm the first to win a major, and if that's the bar, then I've set it." He was the greatest this

week at the Masters, bar none. History will say he won the tournament on Sunday with a final-round 73, but really, he won it on Saturday with a blistering finish that put him atop the leaderboard for good. He went 6-under on a seven-hole stretch of the back nine in the third round, the decisive spurt that nobody could match. Even the final margin on Sunday was perhaps a bit misleading; it only tightened up when Matsuyama

made three bogeys in his final four holes, though the lead never seemed threatened.

Matsuyama finished at 10under, 278. Zalatoris was at 9 under, Jordan Spieth and Xander Schauffele were tied for third at 7 under and Ion Rahm and Marc Leishman tied for fifth at 6 under. Justin Rose, who jumped out in front Thursday with a 65, finished seventh, five shots back.




पावर कॉर्पोरेशन ने मांगी स्लैब परिवर्तन की मंजूरी

लखनऊ। पावर कॉपॅरिशन ने बिजली दरों के स्लीब में बदलाव को मंजूरी देते हुए राज्य विद्युत नियामक आयोग से इसके प्रकाशन की अनुमति देने का अनुरोध किया है। इस संबंध में आयोग को भेजे गए पत्र में पावर कॉपॉरेशन ने दावा किया है कि बिजली दरों को तर्कसंगत बनाने के लिए स्लैब में परिवर्तन 2019-20 के टैरिफ के आधार पर बिना किसी बढ़ोतरी के दाखिल किया गया है।

वहीं आयोग ने कॉपोरेशन की दलील को खारिज करते हुए कहा कि स्लैब परिवर्तन को मंजरी देने का फैसला उपभोक्ताओं व उपभोक्ता संगठनों की राय जानने के बाद किया जाएगा। आयोग ने पावर कॉपॉरेशन को तुरंत नए स्लैब व प्रस्तावित दरों का प्रकाशन कराकर लोगों से आपत्तियां व सुझाव मांगने को कहा है। इस बीच कॉर्पोरेशन ने वाणिज्यिक श्रेणी में बनाई गई चार किलोवाट भार तक की नई उपश्रेणी में पूर्व में प्रस्तावित फिक्स चार्ज 330 रुपये प्रति किलोवाट प्रतिमाह के स्थान पर 360 रुपये किए जाने का भी अनुरोध किया है। वहीं बिजली दरों के नए स्लैब को की मुहिम को झटका लगा है।

अगस्त में 600 करोड़ रुपये बढ़ी सरकार की कम

लखनऊ। कोविड-19 महामारी के दौरान लॉकडाउन से पटरी से उतरी अर्थव्यवस्था अब रफ्तार पकड़ने लगी है। पिछले महीने अगस्त की राजस्व प्राप्तियां गत वर्ष इस माह की तुलना में 600 करोड़ रुपये से अधिक रही है। इसमें जीएसटी, आबकारी के साथ भू-तत्व एवं खनिकर्म का सबसे ज्यादा योगदान रहा। बावजूद इसके, 2020-21 के लिए राजस्व संग्रह के तय लक्ष्य को हासिल कर पाना आसान नहीं है। इसका कारण लॉकडाउन के दिनों में राजस्व प्राप्तियों पर पड़ा बुरा असर है।

वित्त, संसदीय कार्य व चिकित्सा शिक्षा मंत्री सुरेश कुमार खन्ना ने गतिविधियों में सुधार का लेखा-जोखा पेश किया। बताया कि वर्तमान वित्तीय वर्ष की जुलाई में आर्थिक गतिविधियों

जीएसटी, आबकारी, भू-तत्व एवं खनिकर्म में वृद्धि वित्त मंत्री द्वारा जारी आंकड़ों के अनुसार गत वर्ष अगस्त माह की तुलना में इस वर्ष अगस्त में जीएसटी-बैट, आबकारी और भू-तत्व एवं खनिकर्म से राजस्व संग्रह में अच्छी वृद्धि दर्ज की गई। इन तीनों क्षेत्रों से क्रमशः 203, 427 और 61 करोड़ रुपये से ज्यादा

की राजस्व प्राप्ति हुई। वहीं स्टांप एवं निबंधन और परिवहन विभाग से इसी

अवधि में क्रमशः 8 और 81 करोड़

रुपये कम राजस्व की प्राप्ति हुई।

जारी रहा और राजस्व का संग्रह बढ़ा है। उन्होंने बताया कि अगस्त, 2019 बृहस्पतिवार को प्रदेश की आर्थिक में विभिन्न मदों के अंतर्गत 8942.76 करोड रुपये का राजस्व प्राप्त हुआ था। वहीं अगस्त-2020 में इन मदों में कुल 9545.21 करोड़ का राजस्व के बेहतर होने का सिलसिला शुरू संग्रह हुआ है। यह गत वर्ष की तुलना हुआ था जो अगस्त-2020 में भी में 602.45 करोड़ अधिक है।

सरकार के कदमों से आर्थिक गतिविधियों को मिली रफ्तार लखनऊ। क्रोविड-19 के चलते लगे लोकडाउन के द्यान पटरा में उतरा अर्थव्यवस्था को वापस पटरी पर लाने के लिए सरकार द्वारा उठाए गए कदमों से काफी मदद मिली है। माना जा रहा है कि विधायक निधि स्थगित करने, मंत्रियों व विधायकों के वेतन में कटौती, सरकारी कर्मियों के भत्ते समाप्त किए जाने और डीए को स्थगित करने के निर्णय जैसे कई कदम से सरकार के खर्चों में कमी आई है। वहीं, प्रवासी श्रमिकों, कामगारों व निराश्चितों को 1000-1000 रुपये नकद व राशन उपलब्ध कराकर पैसे का प्रवाह बनाए रखने का प्रयास किया। इससे ग्रामीण अर्थव्यवस्था को रफ्तार मिली है।
